CHESAPEAKE BAY WATERSHED

The largest estuary on the continent, the Chesapeake Bay watershed covers 64,000 square miles and includes more than 150 rivers and streams. More than 300 species of fish, shellfish, and crab and a wide array of other wildlife call the bay home.

While the health of the Chesapeake Bay has improved since the 1970s, excess nutrients and sediment continue to adversely affect water quality in the bay and its tributaries. Agricultural lands (more than 83,000 farms) compose nearly 30 percent of the watershed, and the region – which includes Delaware, Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia.

Caernarvon Township is located within the Chesapeake Bay Watershed.

Liquids disposed of in the storm drains affect the watershed. Grass clippings should not be mowed onto the street as they end up going into the storm drains and also affect the quality of the watershed.

Our goal is to keep the Caernarvon Township residents well informed of upcoming events and important news through the quarterly newsletters. Copies will be distributed throughout the community at locations such as the Village Library, Joanna Store, Heritage Restaurant, Styer Insurance Agency Inc, and Clair's Family Restaurant.
