Reminders

Driveway Pipes - Please check your driveway drainage pipes for clogging caused by debris. Clogged pipes interfere with proper water flow which can lead to issues such as floods and icy roads. Driveway Ordinances can be found on the Township’s website, or stop by the Township Office to review the information, Ordinances No 168 and No 225.



Trash/Recycling Receptacles – Please do not place trash and recycling receptacles in the street for pick up, they should remain behind the curb line or in residential driveways. **When placed in the street they provide another obstacle for crews plowing snow or performing street work. Thank you for your assistance to the road crew.**

Basketball Nets – The Township was recently informed about a school bus driver who was unable to safely pass another driver due to a basketball net that was impeding the flow of traffic. For safety reasons and to prevent damage to personal property, please relocate basketball nets that are in the Public Right of Way. Notices will be given out to residents who do not remove items in the Right of Way. Thank you!

Keeping Roads Clear – We need your help! Please be sure to move your parked vehicles off public streets during snowplow operations. This helps snowplow drivers with snow removal operations, and can prevent your vehicle from getting buried in snow and sprayed directly by salt. Also, parking on the street can make your vehicle more susceptible to damage from other cars and theft.

Parking on roadways during snow events is a violation and tickets will be issued if a vehicle is left on the roadway during snow storms.

Chief of Police Message - Continued**Fireworks - What's Legal and What's Not**


In Pennsylvania -

- Professionals with a permit can use display fireworks (including salutes that contain more than two grains or 130 milligrams of explosive materials)
- Anyone over the age of 18 can buy and use "Class C" or "consumer-grade" fireworks
- Fireworks cannot be discharged on a public or private property without express permission of property owner, from or within a motor vehicle or building, toward a motor vehicle or building, within 150 feet of an occupied structure (whether or not a person is actually present), also cannot be discharged while the person discharging them is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or another drug.

Township History

Morgantown's Irene Montgomery



Blessed with 107 years of life on this planet was Irene Fosnocht (Monday, September 21, 1908 - Thursday, January 28, 2016). Irene was born to Ralph L. Fosnocht and Alberta (Livingood) Fosnocht on Sept 21, 1908. Irene's mother died when she was quite young. Fosnocht and Livingood were butchers along Cherry Lane next to the Morgantown Hotel at the corner of Main Street Route 23 and Cherry Lane (Route 122 - now Route 10). They later moved the butcher shop to Mill Road behind the Village Inn at the corner of Main Street and Mill Road. It had been Petersheim's well drilling building before that.

A short time Irene's family had lived on Best Road and then moved to Goosetown (Willow Glen) where Irene walked to Valley (Pike) School along route 23 just west of Morgantown Village. When they moved to Main Street in the Village in 1914, she walked to the school built in 1905 just across the street.

As a girl, she learned to crochet and knit. These works of art provided beautiful gifts to distribute for wedding, birthday and Christmas gifts. When she married, her husband Roy would make beautiful frames to hold her artistry. She also learned to play the piano which came in handy when she became a school teacher.

When she was age 13, the fire hall next door was dedicated. The Morgantown Methodist Church had a stand there and she helped take care of that table.

There was a big celebration when she was 16.

Morgantown, at Christmas, would put up a huge tree with lights in the center of town. She and her mother decided to walk from their home in Goosetown to see this display. That night it was pitch dark and as they walked back, they missed the bridge and before they knew it, they were knee high in the stream.

She graduated from Caernarvon High School in 1925, but since it only went to 11th grade. Then she took the train from Joanna to Birdsboro and walked up the hill to Birdsboro High School (The Washington Building in Brooklyn in Birdsboro). She graduated from there in 1926 and West Chester Normal School in 1928.

A friend, Roy Montgomery graduated from Pottstown High School. Enamored with each other, they married May 5, 1933.

They had one daughter, Shirley Ann who spent her years growing up and living in Morgantown. Hannah Zook kindly gave Shirley Ann a fist of some baby peeps. It was winter, so the chicks were housed in the kitchen until they were older.

Irene and Roy loved to dance as there was the Morgantown Ride Hall that had a great room for all sorts of activities. Irene loved sports. Many remember when there was a Sunday School picnic at the Methodist parsonage at Goodwill Methodist Church near Loag's Corner when Creed Coulson was running to first base and collided with Irene who was then age 70 knocking her over. She picked herself up and continued to play the game. They built a beautiful gray stone home along Mill Road one block from Main Street overlooking the meadow, forest and stream of the Conestoga. Later, they built a home along Pine Grove Road. This had a beautiful panoramic view of the Conestoga Valley all the way from Elverson to Morgantown. They erected a huge cross every Easter season that was lit at night which shone brightly to be seen from miles around. At Christmas, they erected a huge tree with lights.
