Fall/Winter Maintenance Operations

Winter season is upon us and will bring winter precipitation and property maintenance challenges for everyone. Please allow extra time for travel during winter weather events.

Sidewalk Clearing — Residents are reminded that Township Ordinance No 167 contains information on sidewalk clearing requirements in the Township. The Ordinance states "depositing snow from any driveway or sidewalk into the street is prohibited".

Parking During Winter Weather – Ordinance No 223 prohibits parking on all Township streets during any winter weather event.

Trash/Recycling Receptacles – Please do not place trash and recycling receptacles in the street for pick up, they should remain behind the curb line or in residential driveways. When placed in the street they provide another obstacle for crews plowing snow or performing street work.

Get Important News Fast, Download the CRIMEWATCH App!

Caernaryon Township now has the ability to send the community emergency and important information via "push" notifications to your phone and e-mails. This may include road closures, flooding, snow and police information.

Download the CRIMEWATCH App and make Caernarvon Township your "home" Police Department. You may have to enable "push" and e-mail notifications. Please note, if you already had the CRIMEWATCH app, you MUST delete it from your phone and reinstall the new app in order for notifications to work. See the links below:

FEATURED DRAWING (by Jere Brady) Fingal's Castle, 1750's



One story tells that a group of French people arrived at an inn in the village of Morgantown with questions about the area.

It seems like many of the French aristocracy living in luxury, gave little thought of the poverty around them, but some were suspicious of a possible upcoming revolution and wanted to set up a safe environment in America. Much of Pennsylvania landscape is similar to France.

Soon a castle was built with surrounding cottages. Strangely, after some time this community disappeared as quickly as it came.

Fingal Castle's property is verified on old 1750's tax records. Old maps show the location of the castle near the western boundary of Caernarvon Township in Berks County, Pennsylvania.

George Lyman Beam (1874-1957) remembers his boyhood friend raised by his single mother lived in the ruins of the castle. Even as a child, George was fascinated with the huge impressive doors. He remembers Fingal being pronounced feen-ga. That pronunciation might verify it was French. Four Wertz sisters and Bill Rodgers also lived in a section of the ruins. Years later, despite most of the castle being gone, many flowers still dotted the landscape such as daffodils and other perennials but soon the area became overgrown by trees, weeds and vines.

A 1750's map shows the property owned by Peter Fingual Finfrock. Caernarvon Township had many German descendants and Finfrock was a nickname of a wealthy man literally meaning – the owner of five coats ~ finf – five and roc – coat or skirt. Interestingly, Fingal is also an Irish name meaning foreign tribe. A man by the name of Fingal was an Irish hero.

As far as the appearance, information mentions that the castle started with a two story log cabin and not long after, large elaborate stone ends were added. Thereafter, many small homes were built nearby the castle. Sitting on the top of the hill, it was obviously an impressive sight. The community consisted of people, cattle, horses, a race track and a pond. It is suggested that it was somewhat like a feudal community with the grand castle housing the noble's family with their servants surrounded with peasants' huts. Some of the cottages were still in use until 1930's. I-176 highway went through that property.

Jere's interest was initiated by first reading the castle article in C.Z. Mast's publication of Annals of Conestoga Valley.
